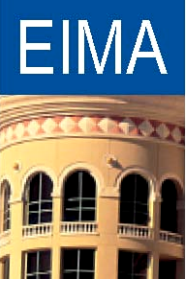

## Need an Inspector?

Need an inspector? When looking for a home inspector for an EIFS home, you should consider the following:

1. How long has the inspector been inspecting EIFS homes? How long in the EIFS business altogether?
2. What type of training has he (or she), both general inspector training and training pertaining to EIFS? If he says he is certified, ask by what organization and the extent of the certification training. (EIMA *does not* certify home inspectors.)
3. ***Always*** ask for at least two good references from *recent* previous jobs.
